Sometimes we avoid giving compliments to other people because we think we will look silly or feel embarrassed. Giving compliments not only makes the person receiving it feel good but also the person giving it.

Let's get use to giving compliments – this is a great resource to encourage children to think about them.

Activity 1: You could do a Quiz, Quiz, Trade activity using them, whereby each child has a card they walk around the class, the first person they come to they stop, and take turns to read their compliment to each other. (Quiz, Quiz) then they swap (Trade) their cards with each other and find another partner. They repeat until the time runs out, can they give out as many different compliments as they can in the time?

Activity 2: Each child stands in class with a compliment card, start with one child who chooses one person by says their name and then reads out loud their compliment to them, the child who receives the compliment then sits down. Each child should have the opportunity to give and receive a compliment.
